



Townies too much for Hawks

Jerome Blair scored three touchdowns and quarterback Sean Arlan scored one touchdown and threw a TD pass as the duo led undefeated East Providence to its fifth Division I victory of the season, 38-3 over Hendricken last night at Pierce Field.

The Townies virtually settled the issue late in the second quarter as they broke away from a 10-3 lead with two touchdowns in the final six minutes of the first half.

Blair scored his first touchdown of the night on a 22-yard run with about six minutes to play in the half and the Townies' Steve Zarembka scored a few minutes later on a 21-yard run.

Arlan, who had scored on a 1-yard run in the first quarter, hit Blair with a 20-yard TD pass early in the third quarter and Blair scored his third TD on a 2-yard run later in the third quarter.

Sam Lovett tallied eight points for the Townies with 30-yard field goal and five conversion kicks.

CUMBERLAND 28, COVENTRY 6: Sean Perry rushed for two touchdowns, and Scott Desper scored on a 60-yard dash and caught a two-point conversion pass from Mike Levesque to lead the 6-0 Clippers to a Division II win. Craig Crabtree scored on a 22-yard run for the 3-2 Oakers.

SOUTH KINGSTOWN 41, WARWICK 6: Tyler Foley had eight carries for 75 yards and two touchdowns for the Rebels, who improve to 4-2 overall. Ryan Brophy, Carl Mitchell, Jake Flaherty, and Mason Wilson also had touchdowns, and Andy Fitzgerald made five extra-point kicks in the nonleague matchup. Emmanuel Pane scored the Hurricanes' touchdown on a 40-yard run.

NORTH KINGSTOWN 33, PILGRIM 0: The Skippers scored on their first three possessions. Chris Hines, Joe Bessette, Tom Stralka ran into the endzone and Jake Northup caught a 19-yard pass from QB Joe Bessette for another touchdown. Phil Rattenni kicked two field goals and three extra points for the North Kingstown, now 4-3 overall with the nonleague victory.

WESTERLY 29, MIDDLETOWN 0: Pete Serra had a pair of 4-yard touchdown runs and the Westerly defense recorded two safeties as the Bulldogs improved their Division II record to 5-1. Ryan Mowry added a 2-yard touchdown run for the Bulldogs and Rob Mindeck closed out the scoring with a 12-yard run.

BARRINGTON 28, CRANSTON EAST 14: Matt Coffey had a 26-yard touchdown pass to Brett Azar in the second quarter and then ran one in 43 yards in the third to lead the Eagles to a Division II victory.
